What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how LifeSaver Trans Tasman Equity Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. The fund aims to predominantly focus on capital growth of your savings over the long term. Invested in Australasian shares.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the LifeSaver Trans Tasman Equity Fund:

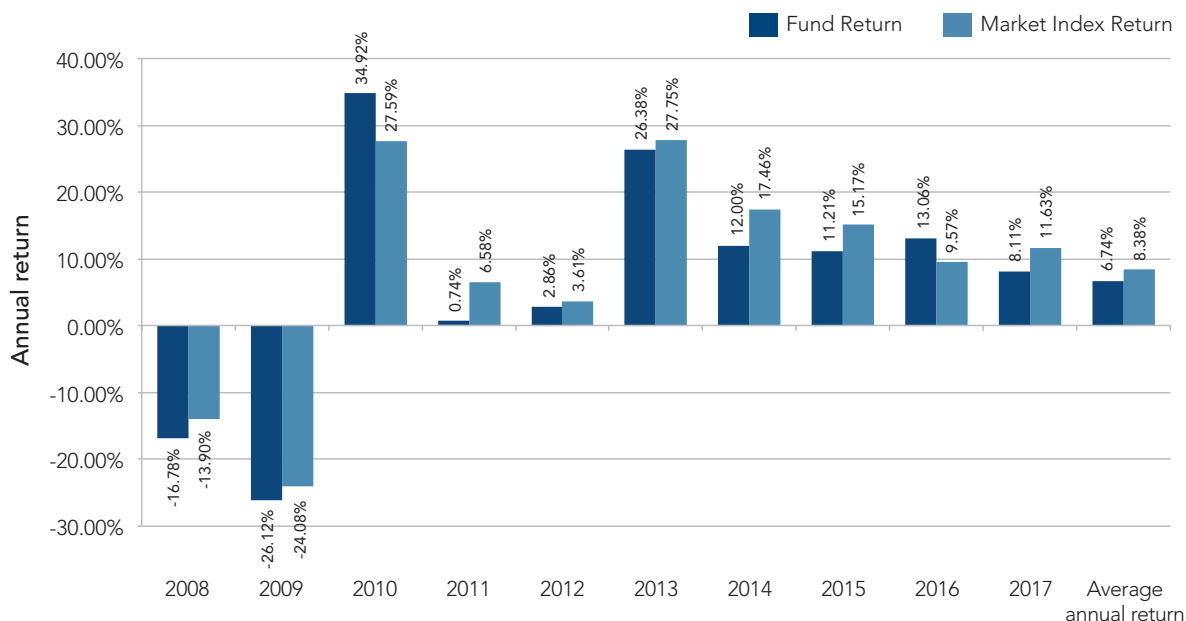

How has the fund performed?

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

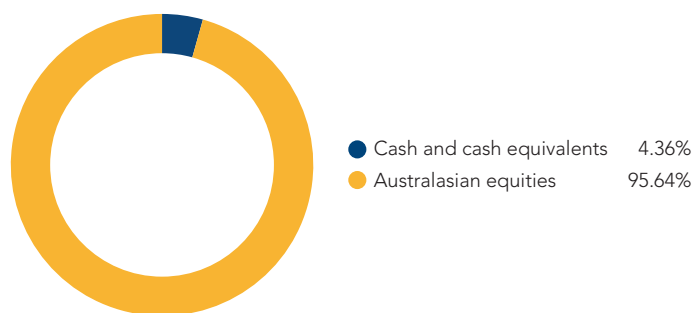
Example of how this applies to an investor

Sarah had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sarah received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,833 (that is 18.33% of her initial \$10,000). Sarah also paid \$97.76 in other charges. This gives Sarah a total return after tax of \$1,735.24 for the year.
