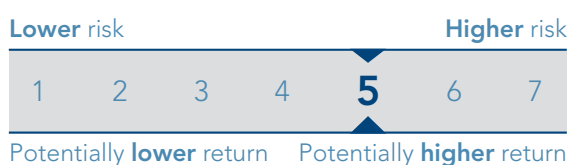
Description of this fund

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Australian Growth Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

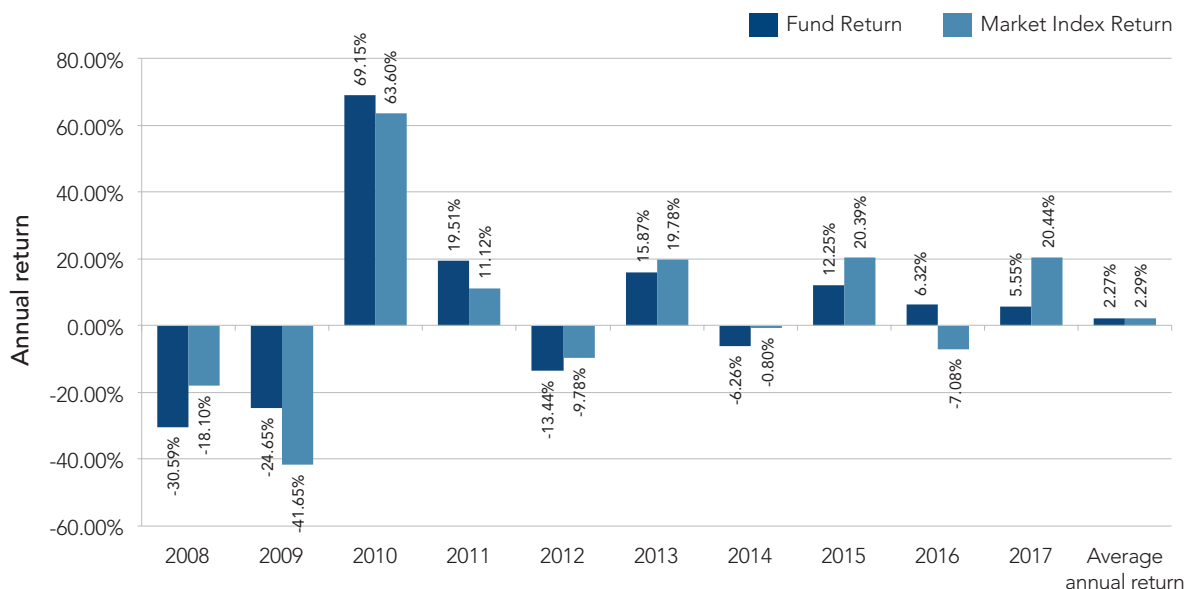

How has the fund performed?

What fees are investors charged?

Investors in the Australian Growth Fund are charged fund charges. In the year to 31 March 2016 these were:

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

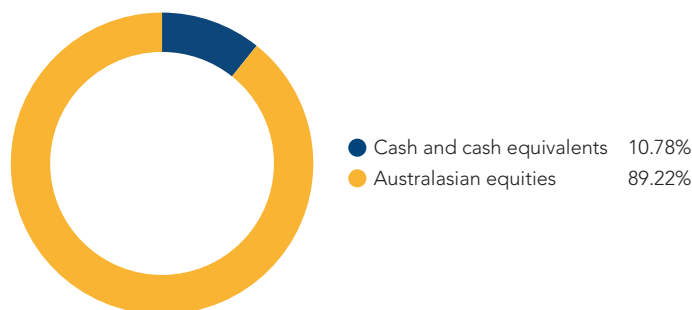
Example of how this applies to an investor

Katie had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Katie received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$555 (that is 5.55% of her initial \$10,000). Katie did not pay other charges. This gives Katie a total return after tax of \$555 for the year.

Notes

¹ The negative performance-based fee expense as at 31 March 2016 is a result of the actual performance fee charged to the fund at 30 June 2015 (0.61%) being lower than the fee accrued to 31 March 2015 (0.71%). Because the performance fee period runs from 1 July to 30 June each year and the calculation period for fees disclosed in the fund update runs from 1 April to 31 March each year, negative performance fee accruals as at 31 March are possible in these types of situations. The performance-based fee accrual is calculated on a daily basis. See the product disclosure statement for more information about the basis on which performance fees are charged.
